The Golf Committee and Jr. are also planning a Countdown golf event, and reverse raffle. This event is planned for Friday, July 29th. Keep your calendars open.

Elks Lodge #143 "Queen of Hearts"

Rules:

1. Drawing will be held on Thursday nights at 9:00 pm
2. Those Eligible: All members with dues currently paid, and their spouses are eligible. Any new member must have been initiated at a lodge meeting before being eligible to play.
3. Tickets are sold throughout the week until 8:30 p.m. on Thursday. (6 for \$5.00 or \$1.00 each). Only one person's name per ticket. There is a limit of \$50.00 worth of tickets per day per person.
4. You must have your first and last name and the number of your envelope choice legibly written on the ticket. Any ticket without a name and an envelope number will be disqualified.
5. There will be 54 envelope number choices: 52 cards and 2 jokers. These cards will be randomly drawn and put into envelopes which will be placed in no certain order on the board. No one will know the placement of any card.
6. On Thursday night at 9:00 p.m. a

ticket will be drawn and the card in the corresponding envelope will be revealed. If it is one of the six pay cards (Queen of Hearts, any Queen of a different suit, or either Joker) the winner is paid according to the structure below. If the card is not a winner, a second ticket is drawn and paid if applicable. If the first card selected is a winner, no second card is turned over. Selected cards will be displayed face up on the board. Pot is progressive until the Queen of Hearts is selected.

7. After the drawing, all tickets are discarded and sales will resume for the following weeks drawing. If the Queen of Hearts was revealed; the remaining cards will be removed from their envelopes, the deck will be shuffled and cards will be randomly placed in envelopes on the board as above in #5.

8. Any entrant winning a prize over \$599.99 will receive a 1099G IRS form. Any entrant winning over \$4,999.99 will be given a 1099G IRS form and 25% of the winning amount will be withheld and submitted to the IRS on behalf of the winner.
