## Superintendent Scoop



May were unseasonably hot and humid. Then there was June; very hot, very humid, and very very wet. July into mid-August was extremely hot, humid, and wet with some of the warmest night time temperatures I've seen. Now, on September 21st, we have fire restrictions and haven't had measurable rain since September 2nd. The problems started with the flood in June. All of the standing water on the course was baked with 5 over 90 degree days, creating a clay pot effect. If you add water to the clay soil and bake it for 5 day and you have a recipe for a clay pot that holds water and roots.



It has been a difficult year to maintain good course conditions in this part of the Midwest.

Our staff has had to overcome our flood, extreme heat and high humidity. With all this to overcome we still had a golf course that was playable.

## Bingo Help Needed

Thank you to those members who have volunteered to help with our Bingo night. We could always use additional members to help us at Bingo on Mondays. As a volunteer, we are only asking you to commit to one Monday a month from 5:00 pm (or as soon as you can come after that) to about 8:30pm. Volunteers will help selling pull tabs, other games, and game sheets. If you could volunteer one night a month it would enable us to cover our regular workers when they are unable to work (sickness, vacation, work, etc...). You must be 18 years old to work Bingo, and you will receive a free meal.

We aerified #1, 3, 4, and 6 fairways just to try to break that pot, but it didn't do it completely. With it being so hot and the amount of water needed to wet the soil, we had some puddling and ponding in areas that most members haven't seen before. Now in September, it's been so dry that the trees are stealing all available moisture around them. An example is #5 green on the back right, the way our irrigation works, I cannot put enough water on that area without either flooding the rest of the green or running hand sprinklers on it three times a day. We will have to re-sod that collar and cut the tree down in the winter.

The disease pressure this year has been out of this world. Every superintendent's fear is 90 degree days, 70 degree nights, and 70 degree dew point. This means that the plant stays wet for a long time because the dew point is so high, and never has a chance to dry, which is a perfect storm for incubating fungus. This is a perfect description of 2010's weather. It seem like I was spraying everyday for some fungus

issue. Along with the disease pressure, the crab and goose grass has had perfect weather for them to take over everything. Our golf course is not alone with this issue. Next year we will have to increase our amount of pre-emergence herbicide to make sure this doesn't get this bad again.

You have seen the damage and heard the explanation; this is what we are doing about it. The weather has been too hot to put seed in the ground after the flood. The effort needed for the seed to germinate, keeping the young seedling moist and cool, and keeping chemicals on it so the plant doesn't have fungus issues, would have been extensive and expensive. So we started seeding #6 fairway after Labor Day.

As of September 19, we had seed germinating. We will keep #6 as a par 3 until the fairway is ready. We seeded #6 with a Blue/Rye mix and also sprinkled in some bentgrass in certain areas. We are starting to seed #1 fairway on September 21, and will seed # 4 fairway no later than September 27.

## Meyer's Minutes

If you talk with people from the southern part of the state our course is still in better shape than many.

Aeration is to be completed on #1 and #6 fairways and seeding will be done. Tees will be top dressed and the women's tee on #11 will be sodded.

Our greens are in very good condition for the most part and this is the prime criteria, I feel, that most players remember when playing a course. As I have had a chance to play more rounds this year, I have been able to notice how hard Jr. and his crew work to make our course playable. I, as

many, have always taken this for granted.

I can now appreciate the hard work they do, so I'm asking you to thank them for their efforts.
